

The Kenny Goss Art Scholarship is set aside for visual art students graduating Booker T. Washington High School for the Performing and Visual Arts who exhibit exceptional artistic abilities and will pursue a major in fine arts** at the college level.

Students who wish to apply for this scholarship must submit the Scholarship Application along with the following items:

- An unofficial high school transcript
- A Typed Essay
 - A. Please explain why you believe you deserve this scholarship and how it will help you achieve your future career goals.
 - B. Must be at least 1000 words in length
- Typed Artist's statement
 - A. In one to two paragraphs, please explain:
 1. What inspires your artwork? What are some common themes that run through your portfolio?
 2. How do you achieve your vision? What mediums, methods and tools do you use?
 - B. If you need further information about how to write an artist's statement, please contact the Goss-Michael Foundation
- CD of 10 original works
 - A. Please specify the title, medium and dimensions in the file name of each image or include a separate sheet.
 - B. JPEG Image files only

APPLICATIONS DUE APRIL 30, 2012

This is a one time, merit based scholarship in the amount of \$5,000 that will be given directly to the student's chosen college or university upon acceptance. Selection is based on artistic achievement, scholastic achievement, school and community participation, and leadership. Recipients will be chosen by a panel of judges comprised of distinguished art professionals.
