Goss-Michael Foundation

What began as the Goss Gallery in 2005 has seen big changes in the years since. Conceived as Kenny Goss and partner George Michael's cutting edge international gallery, by June of '07 the venue's commercial orientation was repurposed as the Goss-Michael Foundation, a nonprofit art space dedicated to presenting works from the couple's collection of YBA (Young British Artists) art, educational programs and outreach to art students. Having left the original Cedar Springs location back in April, the new 12,000-square-foot venue is set to open this fall. "We're still under construction here in lower Oak Lawn, but really looking forward to opening and getting our programming underway," Foundation Director Joyce Goss says. With its industrial look and concrete floors, Goss describes the ambience as "more of a London art gallery or museum kind of feel."
